CLOSED SESSION

Attorney Heiligenstein said if Council wants to discuss the Collective Bargaining agreement for the police in detail then we could go into closed session. The basics of the agreement are a 3% raise annually, a 2% longevity increase at specific years, city portion of the health insurance to go from 75% to 80%, and an increase in the starting wage of \$2.00/hr. The concessions made were no holiday pay if taking vacation on a holiday and some changes in bidding and scheduling. This was done in hopes that our department will be more competitive and that we will see some longevity in our officers.
